Broad learning areas identified for the entire school curriculum reflect the nation's capacity to address the challenges of sustainable development in a rapidly changing national and global context. Furthermore, it is evident that the broader learning areas have been identified to meet the demands that keep on evolving over time. Similarly, while the subjects in the existing school curriculum are being modernized, new subjects are also introduced.
